Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left". Like James and John in today's Gospel, we too are longing for the day that we will sit at "Jesus' right and left" in His glorious kingdom. There is nothing wrong by desiring this. In fact, Jesus even encourages each of us to strive to reach that "highest" in His heavenly kingdom.

However, the questions are: How can we get there? And what shall we do to achieve that? These questions are answered by Jesus in the Gospel today: "whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all".

We cannot be servants to others unless we put others before us. We must truly have the willingness and desire to "serve and not to be served", to give and not to be given. In the meantime, we cannot be the "slave of all" unless we sacrifice our own "rights". Learn from Jesus Christ, that he had the right to condemn the whole human race in eternal damnation but he gave up that right and became the victim of sins for many. He had the right not to forgive us over and over again but he didn't exercise it. He had the right not to subject himself to suffering and death but he sacrificed that right and died on the cross for the payment of our sins.

Therefore, in order to sit at Jesus's right and left in his kingdom, we need to serve others through the means of mercy, compassion, patience, perseverance, tolerance, forgiveness, selflessness, meekness, and kindness. It is easy for us to expect others to serve us through these means; but perversely we don't do this to others. "To be slave of all" means sacrificing one's own time, talent, and treasure for the good and salvation of others. Spending time with the lonely, the forgotten, the sick, the abandoned, helping those that cannot help themselves, and feeding those don't have the means to feed themselves. It is then you will be "the one on my right and the other on my left" in my kingdom. *- Fr. Joe Pham*




